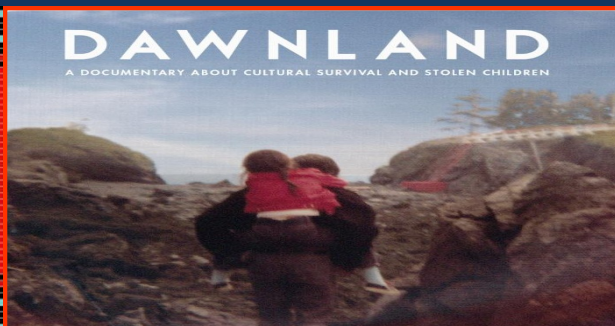

DIVERSITY FILMS CONTINUES IT'S SERIES ON HISTORICAL TRAUMA:

FOR MOST OF THE 20TH CENTURY, GOVERNMENT AGENTS SYSTEMATICALLY FORCED NATIVE CHILDREN FROM THEIR HOMES AND PLACED THEM WITH WHITE FAMILIES. MANY CHILDREN SUFFERED DEVASTATING EMOTIONAL HARM BY ADULTS WHO SHAMED AND DEMEANED THEM, AND TRIED TO ERASE THEIR CULTURE. FOR OVER TWO YEARS, NATIVE AND NON-NATIVE COMMISSIONERS TRAVELED ACROSS MAINE TO HEAR TESTIMONY AND BEAR WITNESS TO THE DRAMATIC IMPACT OF THE STATE'S CHILD WELFARE PRACTICES ON WABANAKI FAMILIES. DAWNLAND TAKES VIEWERS TO WABANAKI COMMUNITIES AND INSIDE THE TRUTH COMMISSION AS IT GRAPPLES WITH THE MEANING OF TRUTH, RECONCILIATION, RACIAL HEALING, TRIBAL AUTONOMY, AND CHILD WELFARE SYSTEM REFORM.
